Will start with a possible definition

Double counting is the un-intentional double counting of persons, or datasets, which, in the end, give an inaccurate view of what the data really means.

Occurs basically due to the fact that one individual (client / patient) may have more than one institutional contact within more than one institution during a specified reporting period. (Origer, 1996)

... why is double counting important?

- Reliable information on drug users;
- Reliable estimation of drug prevalence;
- Help in the development of efficient drug policies;
- Action programmes;
- Research activities;
- Etc.



...what we did?

Analised data provided in four different sources:


- TDI Review survey (2009)
 - At what levels are efforts made to avoid double counting in your country? [Q27]
- Assessment survey (April 2011)
 - Is there an overlap in the recording practices between the different types of treatment centres as they are notified in the TDI? [Q5.4]
- Fonte reports / KI assessment (2011)
 - Double counting. Please provide any information on measures adopted to prevent double counting of persons? [Q3.2.2]
- National reports (2011)





...and we saw that:


- 29 out of 30 countries have some form of double counting control mechanism in place;
- 17 countries controls for double counting at national level;
- 9 countries said that there is overlap in the recording practices between the different type of treatment centres;
- only in 6 countries information are available for mechanisms of control (date of first and last treatment = 3; unique id codes = 3).

























...reason why recording TDI does contain overlap:

"overlap between treatment centres"




...reason why recording TDI does contain overlap:

Spain

"Overlap between treatment centres and autonomous communities"

...to conclude:

Ad-hoc analysis on potential overestimation of the number of clients reported to TDI

- implications on the estimates of drug use,
- and on estimates of the total number of people in Treatment,
- estimate the level of overlap.

Possibility collect more information (Fonte?)

- Detailed information on where double counting occurs including:
 - existance of ID codes,
 - coverage,
 - overlaps,
 - protocols,
 - etc.
