Content related conclusions -1

- High level of opiate users share among all TDI patients, smaller among first treatment (Malta, Swiss, Greece)
- Decreasing trend in opioids (heroin) use
 - shown by data from various sources (Swiss)
 - TDI data decrease in share but increase in absolute numbers (Greece)

Content related conclusions -2

- Increasing trend in cannabis use shown by TDI data
 - What does it mean?
 - Increase in use or in coverage of reporting system
 - TDI cannabis patients are all cannabis dependent (problem users)
 - What are the factors?
 - Increasing prevalence of cannabis problem use
 - Political influences
 - Increasing awareness

Methodological conclusions

- Issue of "opiate" oriented treatment offer
- Controlling changes in coverage of reporting system as a key issue when interpreting trends in drug use
- Analysis of percentage distribution according to main drug should be accompanied by analyses of trend in absolute numbers
- Advantages of using data from various sources for common analyses.
- Time Lag to treatment greater for newly emerging drugs
